#### Monthly Feature – A New Aviation Adventure Submitted by Maria Esparraguera

We all have to stay current, so why not shoot that instrument approach at an airport with a good restaurant?

Recently, I went to Hagerstown Airport, KHGR. From 0W3, it's about 70 nautical miles away, a cross-country flight. Up until the very end of the flight, where there are two ridges, it's mostly lightly rolling farmland, making it a safe and comfortable flight. I followed a route over Gettysburg Regional (W05) to avoid restricted airspace over P-40 (not expanded).

I can't explain in words how much I love to be able to soar to a place that's so far away, then jump out and have a delightful meal. While many airport restaurants are greasy spoons--and there's nothing wrong with that--some are just perfect. Hagerstown is one of them. It made Flying Magazine's "Best of the Best \$100 Hamburgers" -from across the US. This meant it was lumped in with Montauk, NY (KMTP), on the very tip of Long Island, and other super-picturesque sites.

A towered airport (Class D), HGR has two intersecting runways (7000 and 3000 feet). The FBO, Rider Jet Center, is next to Nick's Airport Inn. ATC wasn't busy and seemed so patient with someone who couldn't quickly read back quickly a fairly long set of taxi instructions (3 taxiways and across the other runway). I knew this was going to be a good place when I went into the women's bathroom and a large print, below, was prominently displayed.





As I taxied in, a lineman in a golf cart led me to a prominent parking spot right under the canopy to the restaurant—and emphasized that there's no landing fee, but if we eat there, we can have a discount on gas. There was a small, red mat as I stepped out of the plane (the red carpet!) and walked all of 10 steps to the entrance—I felt like royalty.

The food was wonderful (French Onion soup, portabella sandwich, tasted the fries—oh, my!). The waitress, Kati, was sweet—and I cannot tell you how modern, clean and appetizing it all was. I would recommend it in a heartbeat and go back again. Just a very pleasant trip-

Looking for a place to explore from there, I flew to W35, Potomac Airpark, in Berkeley Springs, WV. While it has a long



runway, at almost 5000 feet, and it is easy to spot right by a river, I would not recommend it. Because of its location, with a wooded ridge on one side and a river and city on the other, there are very few alternatives if you lose an engine anywhere close to the pattern. The runway numbers are so faded so as to be almost indecipherable. The runway itself has been used as a dragstrip; there are ample rubber tire tracks on the landing side of 29, although they are easy to avoid. What bothered me was the lack of planes, lack of facilities and general remoteness.

The suggestion for today is KHGR—I hear that there's a nice museum in town—for another day...


