SAFE Educational Opportunity, March 23, 2022

I saw Safe Alternative Foundation for Education, Inc. (SAFE) on the news one morning and was intrigued. Van Brooks spoke of the uphill battle he faced in his life after a sports injury at the age of 16 that paralyzed him from the neck down, unable to talk, eat or feel. His dreams of playing football professionally were shattered. In spite of such a tragedy, he went on to graduate from Towson University with a Bachelor of Science in Mass Communications. Van developed the SAFE Program to inform students about the importance of obtaining an education as well as having an alternate career plan in anticipation for life's deviations. SAFE provides afterschool, weekend, and summer learning educational opportunities through vocational programs that provide real world application as well as exposing students to the world outside of their community.

I emailed Van and he asked if the Maryland 99's could speak during one of their Women Wednesdays in celebration of Women's History Month in March. After arranging a date and time with the SAFE Center Assistant, Sharone McRae, Lauren Brenneman and I agreed to present on the various aviation related jobs that women have and can pursue. We created a poster board displaying a few of the various jobs featuring women and we spoke to the children about the jobs. The children were the best part of the speaking engagement. These children, age 11-14, were so engaged and asked a million questions about both flying and non-flying type of careers. We handed out a few activities to do, including spelling your first name using the phonetic alphabet. Every single child in the room wanted to spell their name and every name they could think of with the phonetic alphabet. After the hour long discussion, we wrapped it up by asking if anyone was going to get into an aviation related career now. There were a few hands that excitedly went into the air professing their new love of the topic.

I emailed Sharone about the upcoming Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum's Open Cockpit event on Saturday, April 9, 2022. She was excited to take the children out on a tour of the planes at the airport and arranged to let me know when they were there so we could touch base.

Martin State Airport Cockpit Day, April 9, 2022

We were asked by the Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum to participate in the Open Cockpit event on April 9, 2022. We had some amazing volunteers that helped out during that day, including Lauren Brenneman, Christine Pullham, Donna Suwall, and Jane Toskes. We set up in the Gallery room next to the museum and had two tables set up with our display and handouts. We previously created a poster board featuring women in aviation for the canceled March 12th event and displayed toy planes generally provided by Donna Suwall for the event. It was an odd set up this time around since the safety briefings were held in that room every 15 minutes. A group would filter in the room and sit down, the safety briefing would take place and the people would then filter out. Some of the people did make use of their time to speak with us about our roles in aviation and how they could get started. We answered questions and chatted with people about aviation in general and spoke about the International 99s Organization and how they came to
